Democrat wins 78% of the vote in light turnout

Home-state support helps the senator at the caucuses attended by 25,000-35,000.

Sen. Tom Harkin of Iowa won his home state's Democratic caucuses Monday night by piling up a big percentage in a low-turnout affair.

Harkin, seeking the Democratic presidential nomination, set a caucus record by winning about 78 percent support, far more than the 60 percent of the vote he said he needed to win impressively. But while Harkin's percentage was high, his drawing power was low.

News organizations estimated about 25,000 people turned-out, but state Democratic Party officials said the turnout would be between 30,000 and 35,000.

Uncommitted Delegates

The party's count of results showed that uncommitted delegates controlled the second-largest block of delegates selected to county party conventions.

Former Sen. Paul Tsongas of Massachusetts was in third place, with Gov. Bill Clinton of Arkansas next, Sen. Bob Kerrey in fifth and former California Gov. Jerry Brown trailing. The outcome was a bit of a rebuff to Kerrey, who comes from neighboring Nebraska and was expected to show some strength in Iowa.

Opposing camps said Harkin's victory showed nothing because he won by default.

J.P. Steffen, the longtime executive director of the Iowa Democratic Party, said Monday's turnout was far less than the 120,000 Democrats who packed the caucuses in 1988, the 100,000 who turned out in 1984 and the 80,000 who showed up in 1980.

"Message to America"

Despite the poor turnout, Harkin said his win was "far better than

"Think how proud you're gonna be when someone from Iowa is sworn in as your next president of the United States. And think how much fun it's gonna be making George Bush apologize for what he's done to the American people."

Competitors' Reaction

Opponents were not impressed. Jim Pribyl, the manager of Kerrey's campaign in South Dakota, said the low turnout shows that Iowans decided the caucuses were politically irrelevant.

"If there's only one boxer in the ring not many people are going to come and watch," Pribyl said.

The caucuses were the first time Democrats anywhere in the nation met to begin the process of choosing their national convention delegates.
